CPR-No Breathing

AFTER CHECKING THE SCENE AND THE INJURED OR ILL PERSON:



GIVE 30 CHEST COMPRESSIONS

GIVE 2 RESCUE BREATHS

Continue cycles of CPR

DO NOT STOP, Unless:

- You find an obvious sign of life, such as breathing.
- An AED is ready to use.
- Another trained responder or EMS personnel take over.
- You are too exhausted to continue.
- The scene becomes unsafe.
